Sheriff's Office: Making Mobile County Heart-Ready

The Mobile County Sheriff's Office took delivery of the first set of Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) courtesy of the AED Special Appeal Campaign, designed to fully-equip all Mobile County Sheriff's Office vehicles with AEDs.

American Heart Association representatives delivered the thirty-nine AEDs to Sheriff Sam Cochran earlier this month. The campaign began last May, when The Mobile County Sheriff's Office teamed up with the American Heart Association in an effort to establish Mobile as the first county in Alabama as a "Heart-Ready" community. Local Mobile residents generously donated funds to the campaign last spring at the American Heart Association's annual Heart Gala.
